

Neriglissar *qīpu* of the Ebabbara – S. Zawadski *Eos* 74 (1986) p. 86 reads the name of the *qīpu* in CT 55 673 ^{Id}U.GUR-LUGAL-*bul'*-<*liṭ*> on the basis that Nergal-šar-bullit is known as a *qīpu* of the Ebabbara (in Nabonidus years 1-6). However collation confirms that the copy's ^{Id}U.GUR-LUGAL-ŠEŠ = Nergal-šar-ušur is correct. Accordingly, it is possible that we are dealing with a previously unattested holder of the office. The appearance of Nabû-nibšari in the text allows a date any time from Nebuchadnezzar to Nabonidus, and as there are large gaps in our knowledge of the holders of the office of *qīpu* in the reign of Nebuchadnezzar there is no reason to exclude the possibility of a new holder. Whether this Nergal-šar-ušur is the same as king Neriglissar is not possible to say. A Nergal-šar-ušur also occurs in the fragmentary piece BM 70929.
